#### Winter Weather

Thank you, parents, for ensuring your child is prepared for the changing winter weather. Please ensure your children come to school with appropriate clothing for the weather (jackets, gloves and toques). Because we believe strongly in the value of daily physical exercise, we have

students go outside at recess and lunch even if it is raining or snowing. During periods of significant rain, we may have inside recess and/or lunch. These days will be limited. Please help your child be prepared. Please pack a **change of uniform** for muddy/wet days.



#### Safe Driving, Parking, and the Front loop

We know that parking at Hillside is very limited but please do not pull into staff parking areas while dropping off your children. Please do not park in front of the bus stop.

Please ensure you are driving in a safe manner near the school. Unsafe driving will be noted by Mr. Turkin will be taking photos of unsafe driving and forwarding license plates to the RCMP.



We want to encourage parents/guardians to be cautious when driving in the loop. Please only use the loop for "DROP AND GO". Please do not get out of your vehicle in the loop. We need to keep this area moving. Additionally, we would ask parents/guardians to pull as far into the loop as possible before stopping and unload students. We want to ensure the safety of all at school. Please NO LEFT TURNS exiting the loop while there are cones on the street.



- Watch for children
- Obey school zone speed limits
- Do not pass a bus loading or unloading children
- Never pass vehicles stopped at crosswalks
- Pay attention to school crossing guards
- Eliminate distractions
- Use designated student drop- off and pick- up

#### **Parking**

Thank you to all who have been ensuring the safety of our students when it comes to parking in the parent parking lot and on the street. Please continue to avoid parking against the painted yellow curb, by the crosswalk, in front of the school as this allows the students see any oncoming cars in both directions when using the crosswalk. Also, thank you for being considerate to our neighbours by ensuring that when you park you aren't blocking their driveways.

#### Flu Season

As we are in flu season, parents and students are reminded that one of the best ways to prevent getting the flu is frequent handwashing with soap. If your child experiences flu-like symptoms, arrangements need to be made for him/her to remain home for the length of the flu symptoms and at least 24 hours after all symptoms have disappeared. If they are sick, please keep them home.

#### Help your child sleep well

- Set up a bedtime routine to help your child get ready for bed and sleep. For example, read together, cuddle, and listen to soft music for 15 to 30 minutes before you turn out the lights. Do things in the same order each night so your child knows what to expect.
  - Have your child go to bed at the same time every night and wake up at the same time every morning. Children who have consistent and regular bedtimes are less likely to have behaviour problems than children who do not have regular bedtimes.
  - o Keep your child's bedroom quiet, dark or dimly lit, and cool. Keep TVs and computers out of your child's room.
  - o Limit activities that stimulate your child, such as playing and watching TV, in the hours closer to bedtime.
- If your child wakes up and calls for you in the middle of the night, make your response the same each time. Offer quick comfort, but then leave the room.
- Help prevent nightmares by controlling what your child watches on TV and video games
- Have your child take medicines exactly as prescribed. Call your doctor if your child has any problems with his or her medicine.

#### **Emergency Preparedness**

To enhance our students' safety and well-being, we are expanding our school's efforts to prepare for a critical incident. It is important that you become familiar with the school's emergency procedures and what you should do in the event of an



emergency at the school. In efforts to be prepared we will be having some drills in the next 6 weeks. We encourage you to discuss how you expect your child to behave and respond during an emergency or disaster situation

#### **Critical incident Terminology**

- Shelter in Place Students and staff remain on site. This may be due to a flood, powerlines down, a hazardous spill near the school etc. Essentially, evacuating is more dangerous than remaining in place.
- Evacuate Students and staff evacuate the building, generally to a specific nearby location. Typically, due to events like a fire.
- Hold and Secure Also referred to as a lockout. In this case students remain in the building, but external doors are locked. Students and staff are asked to remain in the classroom while a situation is resolved. Typically used for a police incident near a building.
- Lockdown A lockdown isolates students and staff from a threat outside or within the building. This is generally considered the most significant level of response and controls the movement of people both within and near the building. Internal and external doors are locked.

The school is prepared to care for your child in the event of an emergency until you or an authorized alternate come to pick him or her up. To make your child as comfortable and safe as possible until you arrive, we ask for your help in the following areas.

- Please **do not phone the school following a disaster.** We must keep the lines open for outgoing emergency calls.
- Please, in the event of a lockdown, do not phone your child's cell phone. A ringing phone can call attention to students.
- Please **do not drive to the school.** Streets and access to the school must remain clear for emergency vehicles. Park as close as you safely can and walk to the school.
- Listen and watch for updates both the school and District will use a variety of communication tools including phone trees, e-mail, traditional and social media to alert parents of the current situation and next steps.
- As soon as school officials indicate it is safe to pick up your child, we request you or your alternate guardian travel to the school or identified student-parent reunification site to reunite with your child.
- No student will be released from the school unless a previously authorized parent/guardian or alternate comes for the student.
- All parents/alternates who come to pick up children must sign the students out at a designated student release area.

One of the most important areas of school emergency planning is gathering accurate information so the school can contact you or someone authorized to act on your behalf. Please ensure the office has up to date contact information at all times.

Thank you for your cooperation and assistance. This process helps to ensure a speedy reunion for you and your child and contributes to the safety and well-being of your child in an emergency.
