






Your child has expressed an interest in joining the Reading Link Challenge at Hillside Traditional.

About RLC

Reading Link Challenge (RLC) is an award-winning public library/school partnership program that promotes the "sport of reading." Librarians from FVRL work with school librarians to recruit teams of six students in grades 4 and 5. The program is run as a series of quiz/trivia challenges with questions based on six preselected books. All teams participate in one or more levels of challenge, with the winning teams advancing to higher levels of competition within the community. At FVRL, the levels of challenge are as follows:

School Challenge - All teams challenge other teams in their school.

Library Challenge - School winning teams challenge each other at an FVRL location.

Community Challenge - FVRL Library Challenge winning teams challenge each other.

Grand Challenge - Winning teams from FVRL, Coquitlam, North Vancouver City, New Westminster and Surrey Library systems challenge each other to determine an overall winning team.

Participants learn about teamwork and how to read for retention. RLC also promotes public library usage and encourages children to develop a lifelong habit of reading for pleasure.

Frequently asked questions:

Do students have to read all the books? No. Some teams divide the books so that each member chooses one to know really well. Most students read three of the books, many read six.

Who selects the books? A team of library staff from participating lower mainland libraries and volunteers from the University of the Fraser Valley library technician program. We look for books that includes wide gender appeal, varied reading level, positive reviews in library journals, multicultural themes, and Canadian/BC authors.

Who creates the questions?: UFV student volunteers write the questions. Library staff members edit questions. The questions include multiple choice, true or false, and short answer.

Student commitment is of utmost importance as this is a Team endeavor. Students will be expected to read at least one book and meet with their team, during school hours at least once a week to discuss progress.
