Health & Safety

We continue to follow the recommendations from Dr. Bonnie Henry and her team at the Provincial Health Office (PHO) who work in conjunction with the BC Centre for Disease Control. Our schools have enhanced safety protocols in place that include extensive cleaning and other safety measures such as hand-washing stations, mask protocols, and student cohorts. Communication Protocols

We will continue to keep parents and guardians informed in a timely manner on any significant updates with our school operations. This will include things such as school schedules, any operational changes that may be required, as well as any Fraser Health notifications that need to be sent home. A reminder that Fraser Health remains the regional authority on all medical issues related to COVID-19 and will direct the school district should there be an exposure in a school. Recently, Fraser Health adjusted the communications they send home, with additional letters to better clarify the extent of an exposure in a building. We will continue to ensure that this communication is efficient and transparent. I would also add that I appreciate everyone's continued vigilance with regards to COVID, as our schools reflect the success of the community in limiting exposures from COVID-19.


Winter Break (Dec 21st - Jan 4th)

At this time, there is no indication that the provincial government is planning to extend the upcoming Winter Break. This would be a provincial decision and not one controlled by the school district. The decision would come from either the PHO or the Ministry of Education. I would further add that the impression I receive from provincial authorities is that closing
