Kindergarten Registration

Foundation Skills Assessments—FSAs

The Foundation Skills Assessment is an annual province-wide assessment of all B.C. students' academic skills in grades 4 and 7, and provides parents, teachers, schools, school districts and the Ministry of Education with important information on how well students are progressing in the foundation skills of Reading, Writing, and Numeracy.

This year's assessments will take place on February 12 — March 26, 2021.











The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is coming to your school in January/February!

Mission School District has partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the
Middle Year Development Instrument (MDI). The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of
its kind to gather information about the lives of children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own
perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on
promoting children's personal and social competencies.

Grade 5 and 8 students are invited to complete the MDI during class time between:

January 11th and March 5th, 2021.

All your consideration and participation in our children's school is incredibly appreciated no matter how small or hands on. We are all in this together!



- Discourage competition based on clothing

It is important that we all support the requirement of the Hillside Traditional Academy uniform guidelines.

WHITE SHIRT - White golf/polo shirt, , white dress shirt or blouse with collar

CRESTED POLO – Royal Blue crested polo with collar

CRESTED OVERLAY - Royal Blue crested pullover/cardigan style sweater or Vest

PANTS - Uniform - Dark Navy dress pants

SHORTS - Uniform - Dark Navy flat front - Mid Thigh/Knee Length

SKORT - Uniform - Dark navy skort - knee length

JUMPER – Uniform- Dark Navy Jumper – knee length

SHOES - All black or can have up to 10% color.

SOCKS/TIGHTS – Solid Colours, Black, White, Navy or Royal Blue. Tights. (Leggings must be ankle length with corresponding socks.

ACCESSORIES – Hair, Jewelry etc should follow the school colours and not be distracting to the other students in the classroom

Our students are ambassadors for Hillside Traditional Academy in the community; well-groomed students who wear well maintained uniforms create a positive image. We believe that the responsibility for maintaining the dress code rests with the parents and students together.
